## CULNC COVID-19 Code of Conduct

## Umpire

- i. Register upon arrival with the Cambridge Team captain present, as part of Track and Trace Protocol.
- ii. Sanitise your hands upon arrival and departure and as otherwise necessary.
- iii. As an umpire, you are responsible for enforcing all current EN rule modifications:
  - a. All players must not position within 4ft (1.2m) of any other player at the start of play. GS/GK are required to start inside the Goal Circle
  - b. 4ft marking Increased from regular 3ft marking
  - c. 4ft position of penalised player
  - d. Removal of toss ups
  - e. Removal of idle interactions
  - f. Team talks should be conducted in socially distant circles on the court to avoid congesting the bench area
  - g. Social norms including handshaking, goal celebrations, high 5's etc are not permitted
  - h. Shouting is not permitted
  - i. Players to sanitise hands at the start and end of every quarter.
  - j. A freshly sanitised ball will be used for each quarter with a spare clean ball kept in reserve. Post protectors will also be sanitised, so touching these is discouraged.
- iv. Maintain 2m social distancing where possible upon arrival and departure, and from activity.
- v. You do not need to wear a face mask whilst actively umpiring but all coaches, table officials, non-playing team bench and first aiders should wear a non-surgical face mask for indoor netball activity.
- vi. Check yourself and anyone else in your household, for COVID-19 symptoms before you leave for netball activity. If you, or anyone in your household has symptoms, do not attend. If you have been told to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace as a result of being in contact with a known COVID-19 case, do not attend any netball activity and remain at home.
- vii. Any initial concerns relating to the enforcement of these rules should be reported to the CULNC COVID-19 Officer (Club Captain Ciara Agnew), Club Safeguarding Officer (Vice-Captain Jemima Currie) or another appropriate committee member.
